Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to advise you that there has been a positive case of COVID-19 at Orana Out of School Hours Care Service. On advice from WA Health, I am providing the following information.

The case attended Orana OSHC during the morning session on Thursday, 31st March 2022, whilst infectious.

Kindergarten to Year 2 Students who were at OSHC at the same time as the case have been identified as **non-household close contacts** and should get tested within 24 hours. The end of isolation date and time for these students is: Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> March at 6pm.

Under very high caseload settings, students identified as close contacts must take a PCR test or a RAT within 24 hours of notification. Provided the test is negative, and they have no symptoms, they may:

- continue attending school provided they do not develop symptoms;
- attend care services and Outside School Hours Care (OSHC);
- attend sporting or cultural training, practice, or events organised through the school and held immediately before or after school; and
- travel between their usual place of residence and their school, only, avoiding public transport where possible.

At all other times when they are not engaged in an activity listed above, these students should isolate at home. If these students have not developed any symptoms, in this period, the following key dates apply:

Date of end of isolation PCR test: Wednesday, 6<sup>th</sup> April or

Date of end of isolation RAT test: Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> April

End of isolation date and time is: Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> April at 6pm.

Please upload the initial PCR or RAT result to the Self-Reporting Portal within 24 hours and before attending school/OSHC on Monday. Please then separately upload your child's Day 6 PCR or Day 7 RAT result using this link. <https://cewa-collections.powerappsportals.com/COVID-19-Self-Reporting-Form/>

If a student develops symptoms or becomes a household close contact (for example, if a family member is confirmed COVID-19 positive), these arrangements above do not apply, and they must stay home and isolate for 7 days.

Further advice for all families and staff:

- Orana OSHC remains open.
- If your child was not at OSHC at the same time as the case, your child is not a close contact.
- As for everyone in Western Australia, we ask that you monitor your child/yourself for symptoms of COVID-19 and get tested and isolate until you receive a negative result, if symptoms develop.
- Please note that the Omicron strain can present with less typical symptoms such as diarrhoea, particularly in children.
- If you or your child develops symptoms, please do not attend the Care Service/school.

This development may make your child feel worried or anxious, as it will many of us who are parents. It is important to remember that you can help your child at this time, first by listening attentively to their concerns, and then by providing some reassurance.
