Dear Parents and Carers,

Child's Name:

I am writing to advise you that there has been a positive case of COVID-19 at Orana Catholic Primary School.

The case attended the <u>Year 6 Blue</u> classroom on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> April, whilst infectious. They were wearing a mask. It has been determined that there are no school based close contacts of this case. Please note that any student wearing a mask throughout the day in <u>Year 6 Blue</u> is not considered a close contact.

Nonetheless, this news should come as a timely reminder for all members of our school community to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms and seek testing if symptoms develop.

Further advice for all families and staff:

- Orana Out of School Hours Care remains open.
- As for everyone in Western Australia, we ask that you monitor your child/yourself for symptoms of COVID-19 and get tested and isolate until you receive a negative result, if symptoms develop.
- Please note that the Omicron strain can present with less typical symptoms such as diarrhoea, particularly in children.
- If you or your child develops symptoms, please do not attend OSHC.

This development may make your child feel worried or anxious, as it will many of us who are parents. It is important to remember that you can help your child at this time, first by listening attentively to their concerns, and then by providing some reassurance.
